

Why Christians are hypocrites.

"The hypocrisy of false expressions" proves demonic influence.



Now the spirit is saying explicitly, that in subsequent eras some will be withdrawing from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits and the teachings of demons, in the hypocrisy of false expressions, their own conscience having been cauterized (1 Timothy 4:1-2).

herever one finds hypocrisy in the form of false expressions, especially in the field of religion, one can be assured that deceiving spirits and the teachings of demons are afoot. This is a simple, objective, foolproof test set forth by the apostle Paul. Today I will apply this test to the world's most popular religion.

One of the most auspicious expressions (it is, in fact, an assertion) of the Christian religion is—

"Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world."
And this—

"Jesus Christ took away the sins of the world."

If it can be shown that the Christian religion—its heralds and teachers—in fact does *not* believe these things (that is, if these expressions are proven to be hypocritical), then the influence of demons and deceiving spirits will be established.

THE SAVIOR OF THE WORLD?

Christianity, in fact, does *not* believe that Jesus Christ either did, or will, save the world. Just ask any Christian about this. A Savior of the world must save the world. Yet the Christians assert that a good portion of the world will suffer in hell for eternity for rejecting Christ. How can this be, if Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world? Please read on.

The Christians don't *actually* believe that Jesus Christ saved the world at Calvary; they merely *say* that He did. This assertion, then—concerning Jesus Christ being the Savior of the world—is a false expression. In fact, the "Christ" of Christianity saved no one, not a single person. How can this be?

Christians consider the cross of Christ to be a mere offer of salvation (rather than a saving act in and of itself) that must be accepted by a human in order for the salvation to "kick in." Jesus did His part on the cross, but it wasn't enough. (This is the dirty little secret of Christianity, that the cross was not enough. But because they



are hypocrites, Christians will never admit this openly. They will say, "The cross was sufficient," but will then follow it with: "The cross requires human acceptance," thus proving that they in fact do not believe that the cross was enough.) If the cross was enough, then everyone would be saved in spite of themselves. Wouldn't they? And yet, as any Christian will tell you, everyone is not saved. The underbelly of the Christian confession—again, something that they will rarely declare on the surface—is that salvation depends, ultimately, not on Christ, but on the supposed human ability to execute a wise decision concerning Christ.

The Christian confession that "Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world," turns out to be a lie. What they really mean is that "Jesus Christ is the potential Savior of the world." If they would only advertise it this way, then they would not be hypocrites. If only they would say, "Jesus Christ saved no one at the cross; He only made salvation possible for everyone. The thing that actually saves you is your faith in the cross," then they would not be hypocrites. But they will never say this because, like the Pharisees of Jesus' day, Christians are whitewashed tombs; they're hypocrites. (The growth of Satan's kingdom requires hypocrisy—1 Timothy 4:2.) The advertisement looks good on the outside, but when

one peers inside one finds only the bones of the dead: in the end, salvation depends on human wisdom; only those wise enough to choose to believe in Jesus are saved. Thus, the effectiveness of the cross is neutralized. Here are the bones of the dead lying behind the whitewashed tomb wall: Jesus Christ did *not* complete the work of salvation.

That the cross was, ultimately, inefficient to save *anyone*, satisfies Satanic desire. Satan wants nothing more than to have salvation taken away from Christ and placed upon human shoulders. Christianity readily accomplishes this for him. Thus, Christians are Satan's ready dupes. Of course. It is Satan himself who has injected the teachings of Human Free Will and Eternal Torment into the Christian doctrinal catalog. These are two of the "doctrines of demons" mentioned by Paul in 1 Timothy 4:1 that force Christians into false, hypocritical expressions.

THE SINS OF THE WORLD TAKEN AWAY?

If the sins of the world were actually taken away at the cross, then why isn't everyone saved? Good question, right? Christians only *say* that Jesus Christ took away the sins of the world. They neither mean it nor believe it.

I have a tract titled, "Salvation Plain and Simple," by Dr. Curtis Hutson of Sword of the Lord publishers. Here you will see the hypocrisy of "Jesus Christ took away the sins of the world" on full parade.

On page 12 of this tract, Dr. Hutson writes—

Every sin we have ever committed or ever will commit if we live to be a thousand years old, God placed on Christ.

On page 13 he writes—

Jesus Christ actually took all my sins, past, present, and future, and bore them in His own body.

Also on page 13 he writes—

Friend, God looked down through the telescope of time and saw every sin you would ever commit. Then He put those sins in one big package and laid them on Christ, "The Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all."

This all sounds very good, doesn't it? Yes. It *is* good. It's the truth. But unfortunately, Dr. Hutson does not actually believe his own words. The words on pages twelve and thirteen of this tract are a whitewashed tomb wall. For here is what Dr. Hutson writes on page 21 of the same tract—

The worst sin in the world is not trusting Jesus Christ as Savior, and that is the only sin for which a man will go to Hell.

Let us review:

Pages 12 & 13—

WHITEWASH: Jesus Christ took away all my sins, past, present and future.


Page 21—

BONES IN TOMB: Jesus Christ took away all my sins except one.

QUESTION: If Dr. Hutson truly believes that Jesus Christ took away every sin except one, then why didn't he state that on pages twelve and thirteen? Satan knows that there are legitimate seekers of truth who may, indeed, find truth. To keep this from happening, these seekers must be lulled into traps. The traps of Satanic deception *require* that there be beautiful, opening presentations. It is the beautiful, opening presentations that attract honest seekers. Consider it Satan's bait. But just like the jiggly, juicy worm attracting a hungry fish, the opening presentations are not Satan's ultimate goal. The worm on the fisherman's hook is real, yes, but a deadly hook lies hidden just behind the worm that will haul the fish from *its* world and will into

the world and will of the fisherman. The hook behind the worm will be the death of the fish.

Something strange happens between page thirteen and page twenty-one of Dr. Hutson's tract. Somewhere between these pages, an adversarial spirit takes over Dr.



Hutson's pen. I mean this quite literally. Just as the holy spirit inspired men to write God's truth, demonic spirits cause otherwise intelligent human beings to unconsciously contradict themselves within a few pages of books or tracts purported to be truth. The tract in question is a prime, startling example of it. The writer is no longer the writer, but rather the tool of demonic spirits.

If Dr. Hutson had stopped on pages twelve and thirteen, then the beautiful presentation would stand and people would know truth. But Satan does not want people to know truth. He wants them to *think* that they know truth, while at the same time introducing them

truth. Between the time of the beautiful presentation and the deadly hook, there is a Satanic sleight of hand that turns truth into lie—otherwise known as hypocrisy. Remember: hypocrisy *must* present an attractive front before the subtle descent into the lie, else it is not hypocrisy. We know from Paul ("the spirit says *explicitly*"—1 Timothy 4:1-2) that hypocrisy



is the hallmark of Satanic authorship.

Dr. Hutson unfortunately continues writing beyond page thirteen—as he must. Satan's kingdom must grow. For Satan's kingdom to grow, Satan requires unwitting hypocrites like Dr. Hutson to write books and tracts purporting to be truth but that are, in the end, lies. On page twenty-one of Dr. Hutson's tract, the deadly hook manifests itself. But it is too late. The fish have bitten. Millions of honest seekers, attracted by the juicy bait of truth, are lulled into the deadly trap of lies: Jesus Christ is *not* enough; Jesus Christ did *not* complete the salvation of humanity on the cross; all the sins of the world have *not* been died for.

Paul aptly describes this horror in his instruction to the true evangelist. 2 Timothy 2:24-26—

Now a slave of the Lord must not be fighting, but be gentle toward all, apt to teach, bearing with evil, with meekness training those who are antagonizing, seeing whether God may be giving them repentance to come into a realization of the truth, and they will be sobering up out of the trap of the Adversary, having been caught alive by him, for that one's will.

The trap of the Adversary is hypocrisy. Those forwarding Christian hypocrisies are the true antagonizers, not those seeking to expose them.

OTHER HYPOCRITICAL ASSERTIONS

"Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world," and "Jesus Christ took away the sins of the world," are not the only whitewashed tomb walls presented by Christianity. Here is another one: "God is sovereign." Once again, this is the truth. But in a Satanic construct—which this is—truth must become a lie. It must not be allowed to stand. Whoever in Christianity declares such a truth *must*—

by Satanic decree—keep talking. They must eventually descend into the lie, which they invariably do. I have never met one who didn't. Whenever truth becomes lie, Satan is afoot. It certainly happens here. Christians in fact do not believe that God is sovereign—nowhere near it. Instead, they believe that each human being has a sovereign free will. A sovereign free will cannot be affected by anything from without—not Satan, and not even God; such is the definition of the word "free." God simply cannot be sovereign in a world containing eight billion separate sovereignties—were such a thing even possible, which it is not. There is only one sovereign will in the universe, and it is God's.

Another standard-issue hypocrisy begins with the popular Christian saying: "Jesus Christ died, was entombed, and rose on the third day." If only they believed it. But they don't. Instead, they believe that Jesus Christ is "God, the Father." Never mind that Jesus Christ never claimed this for Himself. Ask a Christian if God can die and they rightly say, "no." But in saying this, they have already sunk their teeth into yet another

hook, this one being that, if Jesus Christ is God the Father, and if God cannot die, then Jesus Christ could not have died. This doctrine not only denies the death of Christ, but His resurrection. The doctrine of the Trinity, therefore, is of Satanic construct. How does one seduce hundreds of millions of people into thinking that they believe in the death of Christ, while at the same time having them categorically and vehemently deny it? Ask Satan. He has been managing it for nearly two-thousand years now.

BAIT AND SWITCH

Another classification of these deceptions is "bait and switch." Here is the Wikipedia definition of it—

...the ploy of offering a person something desirable to gain favor (such as political support), but then thwarting expectations with something less desirable.

Is this not precisely what the Christian religion does? In order to gain the favor of the unsuspecting seeker, the Christian religion presents things that are extremely desirable to any poor, sinning human, such as 1) the complete acceptance of God by means of the forgiveness of all sins,



2) a sovereign God, 3) a loving God, and 4) a successful Savior. This is the bait that lures the seeking sinner. Once the seeker bites, however, in comes the switch. The switch occurs when 1) the "forgiveness of all sins" of an accepting God turns into the forgiveness of all sins except one from a God still demanding human obedience, 2) "a sovereign

God" turns into a small "g" wannabe deity who gave away his sovereignty, will never get it back, and who can now only hope for the best, 3) "a loving God" turns into an angry deity capable of damning the majority of humanity to an eternity of torture in hell, and 4) "a successful Savior" turns into a small "s" wannabe rescuer whose work on the cross—unaided by humanity—actually saved no one. This pathetic, small "s" rescuer will, in the end, manage to convince only a small portion of those for whom he died to validate his work by believing in him.

Christians wonder why so many passing through their portals eventually become so disillusioned that they depart in disgust to become either atheists or members of a less-hypocritical confession. Those who stay (the stayers number in the millions) become so brainwashed by the cult that they are inured of their own hypocrisies, having been trained to explain them away by such statements as, 1) God is a mystery, 2) God's ways are not man's way, and 3) both things can be true. These are those whom Paul hopes to win, "...seeing whether God may be giving them repentance to come into a realization of the truth, and they will be sobering up out of the trap of the Adversary, having been caught alive by him, for that one's will" (2 Timothy 2:25-26).

A SYLLOGISM

The entirety of my argument may be demonstrated by the following syllogism—

- 1. Hypocrisy and false expressions indicate Satanic influence (1 Timothy 4:1-2).
- 2. Christianity is rife with hypocrisy and false expressions.
- 3. Therefore, Christianity is under Satanic influence.

"NOTHING MERELY IMPLIED"

Paul writes—

Now the spirit is saying explicitly, that in subsequent eras some will be withdrawing from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits and the teachings of demons, in the hypocrisy of false expressions, their own conscience having been cauterized (1 Timothy 4:1-2).

The spirit of God told Paul *explicitly* that withdrawals from faith would categorize eras subsequent to his. "Explicitly" means "fully and clearly expressed or demonstrated;

leaving nothing merely implied; unequivocal." The holy spirit of God does not beat around the bush. There is no mystical language here, nothing difficult to understand. It may be difficult to believe, yes, but not to understand. The withdraw from faith would inevitably come. Underlying it would be "deceiving spirits and the teachings of demons." But how to detect the work of these malevolent forces? The holy spirit covers this base as well, and just as explicitly. Deceiving spirits and the teaching of demons would be known by "the hypocrisy of false expressions."

Ladies and gentlemen, we are up to our necks in it. Paul corroborates his own revelation when he writes again to Timothy in 2 Timothy 4:1-4—

I am conjuring you in the sight of God and Christ Jesus, Who is about to be judging the living and the dead, in accord with His advent and His kingdom: Herald the word. Stand by it, opportunely, inopportunely, expose, rebuke, entreat, with all patience and teaching. For the era will be when they will not tolerate sound teaching, but, their hearing being tickled, they will heap up for themselves teachers in accord with their own desires, and, indeed, they will be turning their hearing away from the truth, yet will be turned aside to myths.

TOMB RAIDER

Every major teaching of Christianity is a myth. Every single one. How can I possibly say that? Because it is so. The truth is advertised on the surface of the religion, yes—I'm not denying that—but when one dares shine a flashlight behind the wall, one discovers nothing but the bones of death and hypocrisy. I've been referencing this analogy over and over again, so it is time now to print it as Jesus uttered it to the hypocrites of His day. Here it is then, in all its inglorious stink. Matthew 23:27-28—

Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for you are resembling the whitewashed sepulchers which outside, indeed, are appearing beautiful, yet inside they are crammed with the bones of the dead and all uncleanness. Thus you, also, outside, indeed, are appearing to men to be just, yet inside you are distended with hypocrisy and lawlessness.

The Living Bible is good here—

Woe to you, Pharisees, and you religious leaders! You are like beautiful mausoleums—full of dead men's bones, and of foulness and corruption. You try to look

like saintly men, but underneath those pious robes of yours are hearts besmirched with every sort of hypocrisy and sin.

See how *The Message* finishes up this passage—

People look at you and think you're saints, but beneath the skin you're total frauds.

The Pharisees still exist, only now they are called "Christians." They are total frauds. Their surface facts are a lie that lure honest seekers into a trap. Before long—and inevitably—the trap is sprung. Facts are diabolically alchemized into fiction. Eternal Torment; Human Free Will; The Trinity—these are all myths not to be found in any properly translated Scripture.

The most sinister aspect of all this is that the Christians themselves remain completely unaware of their complicity in the fortification and growth of Satan's kingdom. They tell themselves that "everything is fine" within their camp. The dupery is deep. Satan has rendered the Christians critically unconscious in order to have his way with them. He has spiked their drinks, rendered them senseless, and debauches them in front of the entire world. It's both embarrassing and tragic. Mil-




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lions of honest seekers with still-functioning brains—who can smell hypocrisy from a mile away—are driven from the only name under heaven by which humanity is saved.

THE CAUTERIZED CONSCIENCE

What does Paul mean at the end of our key passage when he says, concerning those under the influence of these dark forces, that "their consciences [have] been cauterized?" Consider the example of Eternal Torment. It does not bother most Christians to believe that the majority of humanity will be tortured in fire for eternity. They sleep at night just fine. The human conscience, left to itself, could never entertain such a thing as eternal torment, especially not under the umbrella of "the love of God" or of "Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world." The consciences of Christians, however, have not been left alone. They have been hijacked; burned off. This is the meaning of "cauterized"—burned off. Their consciences have been anesthetized to the point that they accept, with a spooky and terrifying acquiesce, the possibility that even their own children might very well spend an eternity in hell. Make no mistake: Satan is powerful enough to trick hundreds of millions (this is the era of myths, after all, and Satan is the father of lies—John 8:44) into denying the God-given "still, small voice" within them. Those forwarding the lie of unending torment do so without flinching, blinking—and certainly without thinking.

Whenever one attempts to point out to these people their own duplicities, the standard Christian defenses include, 1) well, it's a mystery; in other words, "Stop making us think," 2) God's ways are higher than man's ways; in other words, God is a *better* hypocrite than humans, 3) both things can be true; in other words, Jesus can save the world and not save it at the same time; Jesus can take away all the sins of the world and not take them all away at the same time; God can be in complete control and not be in complete control at the same time; Jesus Christ can die and not die at the same time, and so forth. And lastly, 4) the assertion that, "no, *you're* a hypocrite." The best way to answer this last defense is, "No, I'm actually not."

Whenever Christians resort to any or all of these time-worn coverups, be certain that you have won the argument. Smoke a celebratory cigar or take a nip of whisky; for sure spend Sunday morning in your pajamas with the kids. You've earned it. After all, fighting the apostasy is exhausting. —MZ

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
